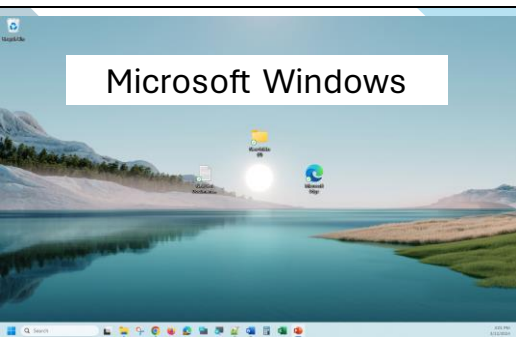

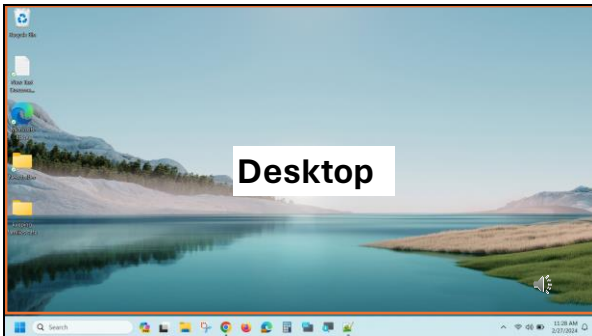

Desktop

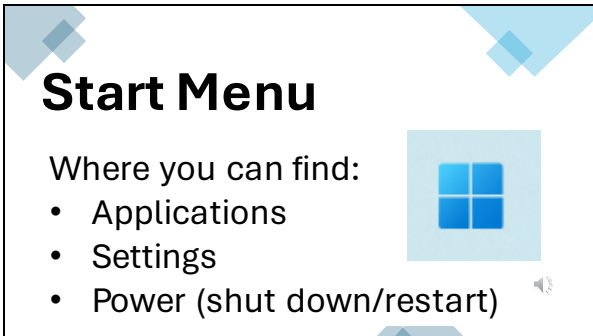
The desktop is a place you keep frequently used applications, files, and folders.

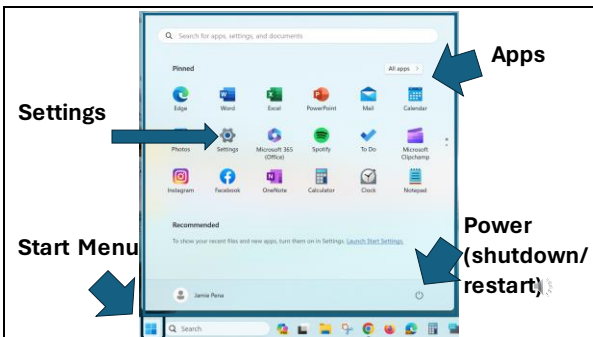


Taskbar


The taskbar is a place to keep programs you use often and see what programs are currently open.









Search

Search





Type 'calculator'.

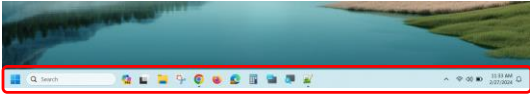


Search

Click the icon or 'open'.



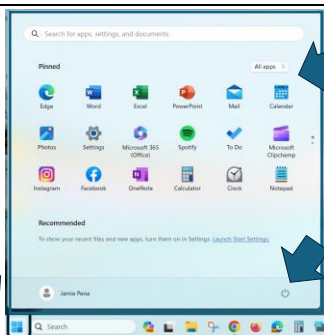

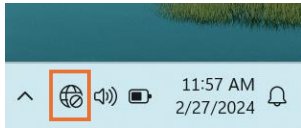

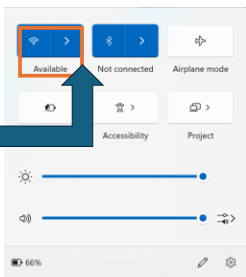

Connecting to WiFi

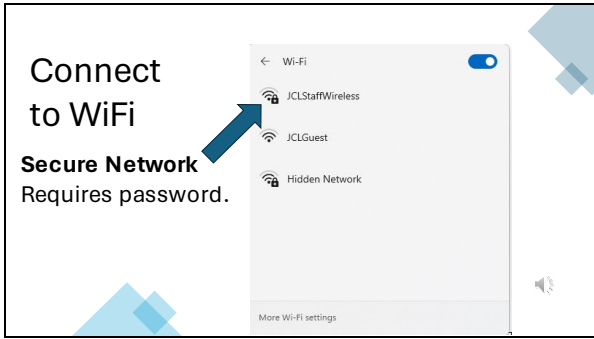


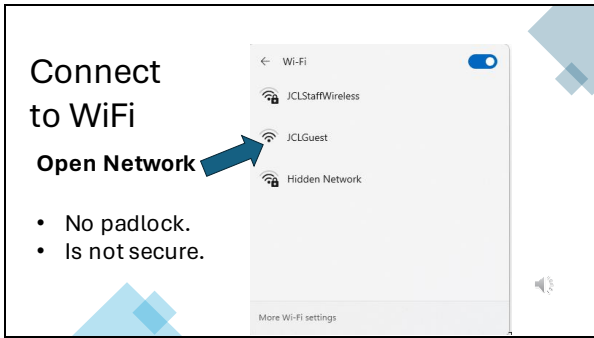
The globe means you are not connected.
Click on it to see available connections.

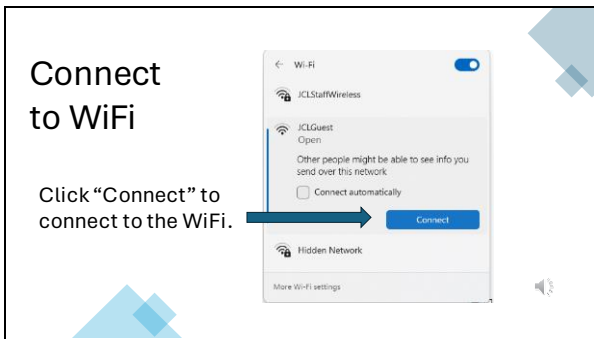
Connect to WiFi



Click the ">" to see available networks.





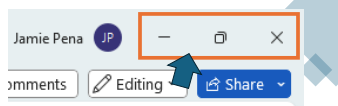

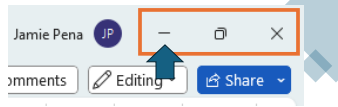
Managing Windows



All windows can be managed in the upper-right hand corner.

Using what you've learned open Microsoft Word.

Minimizing Windows



“-” leaves the program open but puts it on the taskbar.

Minimize the Word document.

Restore a minimized window



A minimized window will appear on the taskbar with “.” beneath it.

Hover over it to see a preview.

Click on the Word document to restore it.

Make a program full screen



Clicking on the square makes a window “full screen”.

Click on the square to make the Word document fill the screen.

Restore Down

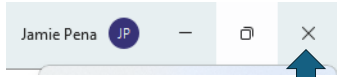


If your window is already “full screen” you will see two squares.

This is called **restore down**. This will reduce the window’s size.

Click on the **restore down** button.

Close



Click on the X to close the Microsoft Word document.

If prompted, choose "do not save."

Creating Shortcuts

You can add applications to the taskbar so they are easier to find.

You can add them through the Start Menu and the Search Bar.

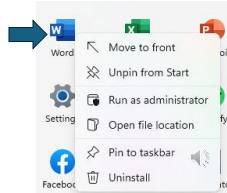


From the Start Menu

Click on the Start Menu.



Right-click on Microsoft Word.



Right-click = press one time on the right side of the mouse.

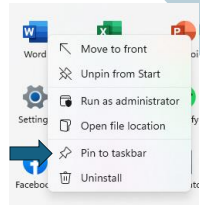
Right-click opens menus.

From the Start Menu

Left-click on **Pin to Taskbar**.

Look at the taskbar.

A shortcut for Microsoft Word has now been added to the taskbar.

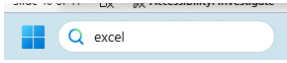


Taskbar Shortcut



From the Search Bar

Using the Search Bar, enter Excel or another program on your computer.



From the Search Bar

Click (left-click) on
"Pin to Taskbar".



- Open
- Run as administrator
- Open file location
- Unpin from Start
- Pin to taskbar**
- Uninstall

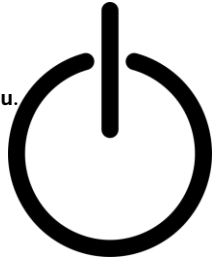

Shutting Down

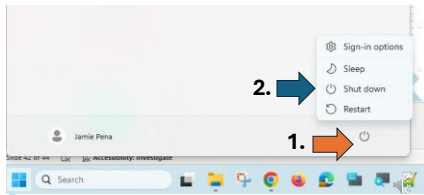
This is the power symbol.
